Chair's Update


June will see the beginning of the end of the dearly beloved old theatre. Deconstruction has been commissioned. In parallel, we are submitting plans for a new theatre. We have informally shared our intention with senior planners to get an idea of some of our proposals and they like what they have seen.

The new theatre is being designed to be long term, climate change resilient and usable in all weathers. The interior will allow for complete flexibility of design to suit the changing circumstances that will drive a creative industry.

We are hoping to enhance our budget with additional funding, but this is not guaranteed. That will dictate to what degree we can incorporate and fit out dressing rooms, tech and prop storage and so forth within the structure.

So we can expect to see plans published online in the next few weeks.

Lesley. My first experience of Sterts was watching Oliver in 2018. My daughter was entranced and wanted to know how she could join. Aladdin auditions came up in 2019 and she got in. I knew nobody to start with and used to sit in the car waiting for her. Gradually I started talking to other parents and people, and started to help chaperone the children. Four years later, I have been involved in many shows doing stewarding, stage managing, costumes and still chaperoning. This year I have taken over as chaperone coordinator and Youth theatre admin. I hear the term Sterts Family a lot and it is very real, I've made a lot of very close friends, as has my daughter. The majority of our spare time is spent at Sterts, which speaks for itself. My daughter and many other children adore it and hate being away from it. It is a very welcoming community, we are always laughing and having fun. The best part of chaperoning is definitely meeting other parents and watching the children grow. I see children that came to us barely able to speak in front of anybody taking leading roles as they get older. Some are now applying to top drama schools. Seeing their journey is amazing. I'm so glad my daughter's love of acting bought us to Sterts.


